Projects in the Hunter Region have received over \$35 million in grants from the Federal Governments Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants program.

**Patron Senator for the Hunter Region, Hollie Hughes** said "As part of the \$2.1 Billion National Bushfire Recovery Fund, the Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants program is helping to support affected communities and their ongoing recovery.
