Joint Media Release Keeping independent cinema doors open in Shortland

The Morrison Government continues to support the recovery of the arts and entertainment sector in Shortland, with \$35,000 being awarded to Lake Cinema at Boolaroo under the \$20 million Supporting Cinemas' Retention Endurance and Enhancement of Neighbourhoods (SCREEN) Fund.

Minister for Communications, Urban Infrastructure, Cities and the Arts, the Hon Paul Fletcher MP, said independent cinemas are a vital component of Australia's economic, social and cultural wellbeing.

"The Morrison Government is continuing to provide one-off business continuity grants to support the cinemas resurgence from prolonged closures and capacity restrictions," Minister Fletcher said.

"We want to keep their doors open, continue offering employment opportunities, and carry on showcasing diverse stories to entertain their communities."

Liberal Patron Senator for the Hunter Region, Hollie Hughes, said the latest grants would allow independent cinema operators to keep providing a popular, low-cost and COVID-safe way for people to go out and enjoy a movie as part of their local community.

"This funding will enable cinemas to recover from severe disruption that has largely impacted their revenue streams, and work towards restoring normal operations as COVID-19 restrictions ease."

Administered by Screen Australia, the Government announced a second round of the SCREEN Fund in December 2021 to support independent cinema operators with grants of up to \$85,000 if they have experienced significant declines in revenue due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
